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## United Through Tree Planting

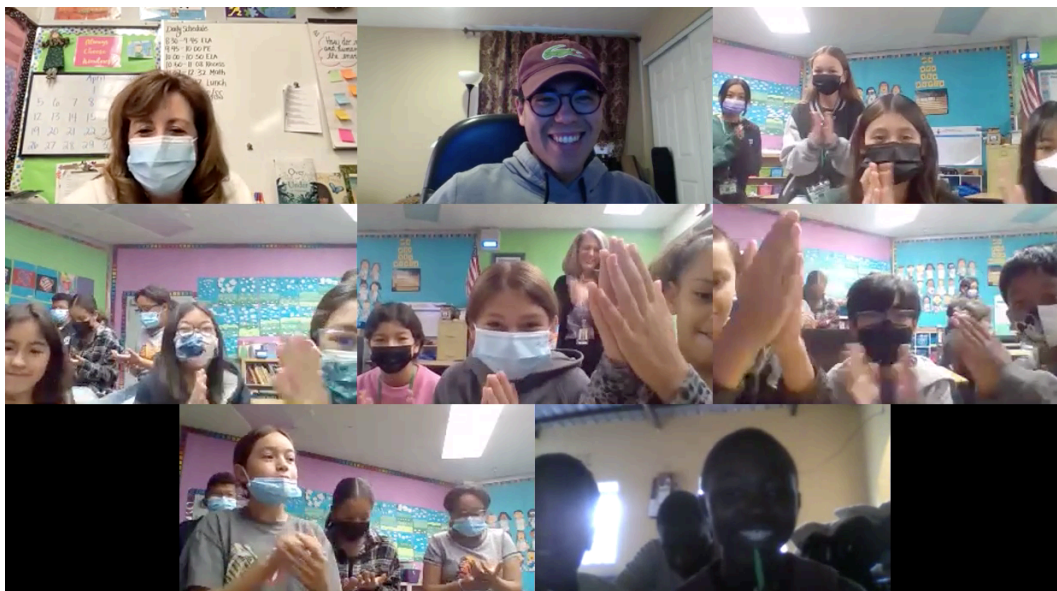
Grades of Green Eco-Leaders have branched

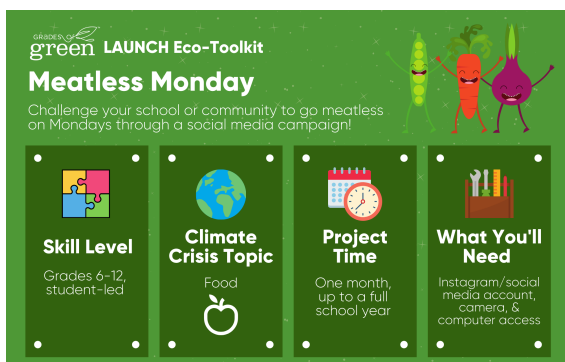
## Toolkit of the Month: Meatless Mondays
